District Councillor James Barlow report on recent activities, OCTOBER 2024

Winterbrook Meadows and Highcroft

Spoken to Berkeley about issues, such as on Brookmead Drive (County Cllr Sudbury worked with OCC offices on this too) and Calvin Thomas Way relating to the build-outs. At Winterbrook they've committed to much better communication with local residents, and at Highcroft they've offered a direct email for Wallingford residents to use in case of comments / questions. I've also contacted Thames Water concerning the reports of sewage on Hithercroft Road after the heavy rains, requesting a meeting.

Walking, wheeling, cycling: James - alongside Town Cllr Mark Hoskins, and SODC Active Travel Champion Cllr Andrea Powell (Crowmarsh) and other volunteers - joined a walking tour with some of Oxfordshire County Council's travel planning team. Shortly we will start work on a Local Cycling and Walking Infrastructure Plan which aims to develop a network plan for walking and cycling which identifies preferred routes etc for future development; a prioritised future infrastructure improvements programme; analysis and narrative to support the identified improvements and network.

Investments: As part of assessing SODC's financial situation, councillors look at how our financial reserves are invested. In October we were briefed on Environmental, Social and Governance (EGS) factors: we discussed how SODC investments can be secure, available as needed for our work and also aligned with our priorities e.g. addressing and adapting to the climate and ecological emergency. This is, suffice to say, dilemma-ridden! For organisations and individuals with savings, loans, pensions or mortgages, out choice of who to bank / invest with can help us 'make our money' work on behalf of or against the things we believe important. Our advisor shared with us

Apparently, our choice of mortgage or pension provider is a big way to influence our own carbon footprint etc! I wonder how WTC manages this?
