	The Chair of the Working Group must be either a Town Councillor or Head of Parks and Estates and elected by the Group.
	 Membership annually. The membership of the Working Group must include at least three Town Councillor and will be Chaired by either a Town Councillor or The Head of Parks and Estates and may include representatives of other Councils (e.g., District, County) and Non-Councillors (e.g., local groups, residents).
Members (non-councillors)	The Council will approve the set-up of the Working Group.
	 Additional or replacement Town Councillors may also be appointed by the Council during the year. The Working Group may be dissolved by the Council or Committee at any time.
